Territorians love recreational hunting and it's an important part of the Territory's unique lifestyle.


As part of Our Plan to make hunting even better in NT the CLP will:

Increase the existing size of Harrison Dam Hunting Reserve

- Work with stakeholders to identify the site for a new hunting reserve
- Introduce an annual \$50,000 grant program to allow local hunting organisations to access funding to help with ongoing conservation efforts


Review the Magpie Goose Management Plan to ensure reliability of data

Lock in Waterfowl daily bag limits (currently 7 magpie geese and 10 ducks) as well as season opening and closing dates (first weekend in September until first weekend in January) for five years to provide hunters with certainty





The CLP will review the Firearms Act, with an initial focus on:



- Giving interstate firearm licence holders the ability to purchase ammunition
- Allowing registered gun clubs hold and sell ammunition
- The renewal of current NT firearms licenses.

The CLP will look to open more government owned or controlled areas to hunting, pig hunting with dogs and bow hunting, on Power and Water Corporation and Land Development Corporation Land.

We will also resolve access concerns to the Howard Swamp and Shoal Bay Coastal Reserve.
